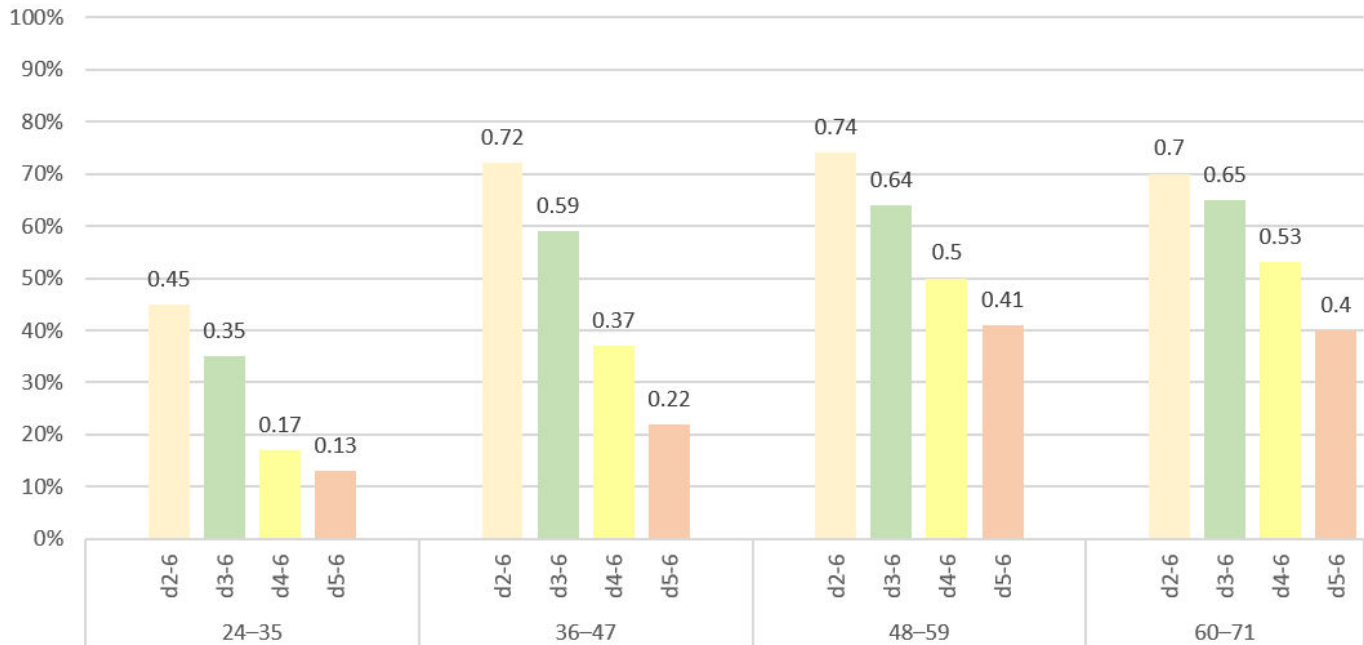
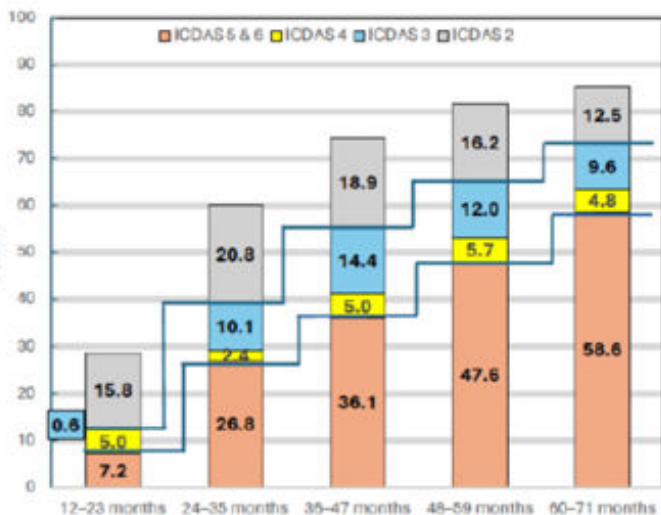

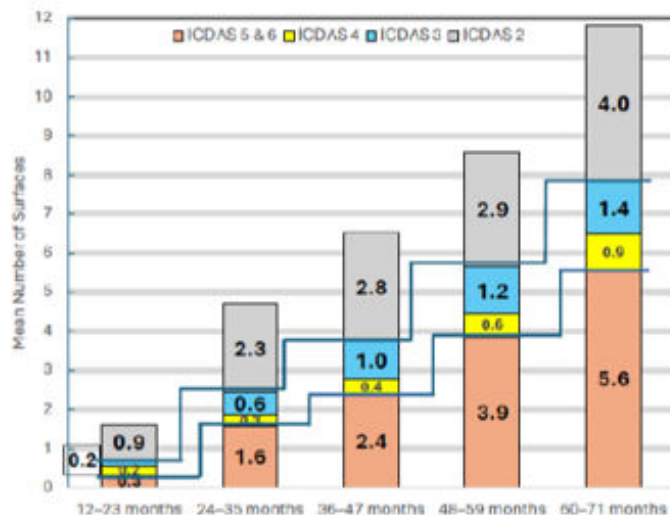
## Prevalence of untreated dental caries ( $d_{2-6} s > 0$ ) using different cut-off points from ICDAS in Chile
